End-to-end comfort in Figma, from rough wireframes to high-fidelity, dev-ready files.

DESIGN TASTE

A strong point of view on what looks premium versus what looks generic, and the spine to defend it.

E-COMMERCE / D2C

Experience designing for e-commerce or D2C brands is a strong plus, not a requirement.

RANGE OF DIRECTIONS

Can take a rough brief and return three strong directions, not one safe one.

We don't expect a finished design system on day one. What matters most: an instinct for what looks premium versus what looks generic, and the confidence to push back when something isn't there yet.
